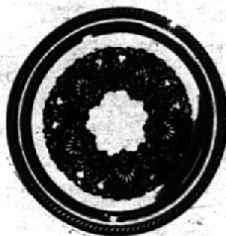


Silverplate Provides Added Savings Incentive

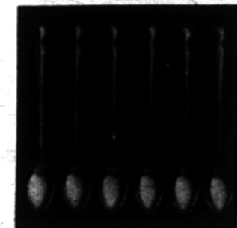

Distinguished Service Award To Metropolitan Official

John P. Seibel, 17234 Lenore, has been awarded the National Junior Chamber of Commerce Distinguished Service Award for the Utica Area.

At 27, one of the youngest senior officers of a savings and loan association or commercial bank throughout the country, he is Assistant Vice President of Metropolitan Federal Savings and Loan Association, a \$40 million financial institution with offices in Detroit, Utica, Dearborn and Birmingham - Beverly Hills.

His rapid rise at Metropolitan Federal Savings from management trainee in 1959 to his present position is matched by his active participation in civic affairs throughout the same period. A charter member and past president of the Utica Junior Chamber of Commerce, he has served as United Foundations Chairman for the Utica area and Shelby Township Chairman for the Muscular Dystrophy Drive. His outstanding civic contribution

has been his organization and guidance of the Community House Project now nearing fruition in the Utica area.

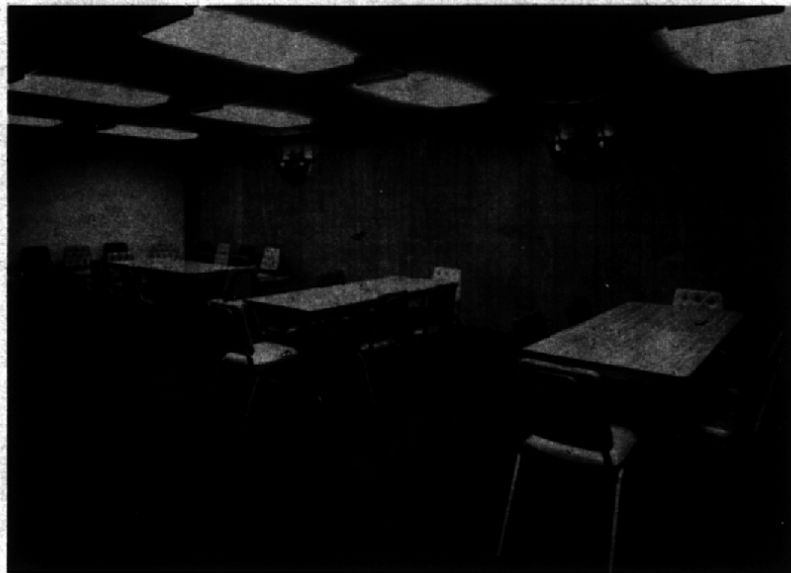

Fast Growing Savings and Loan Association

Consistently one of Michigan's fastest growing Savings & Loan Associations, (with a growth last year alone of 27%), Metropolitan Federal Savings was chartered on January 28, 1952 with a total capitalization of \$200,000. Today its assets exceed \$41 million.

Initial operating quarters, in leased facilities at W. 7 Mile and Waughn made way for the firm's own modern headquarters building at the corner of W. 7 Mile and Evergreen in 1956. That office was expanded several times and continues to be the home office.

Metropolitan's first branch office,

opened in Utica, Michigan in 1957, has since grown to a \$10 million institution. A second branch was opened in Dearborn in 1961 and Metropolitan's third and newest branch, located at 14 Mile and Southfield, was officially opened this week.

Plans for a fifth office to be located in Oak Park at Coolidge and Sherwood are now being finalized.

Roger C. Richards, Executive Vice President and General Manager, forecasts a continuing growth rate of an office per year and total assets in excess of \$100 million by 1970.
