Council Rejects Rezoning Request

A request to rezone the northeast corner of Maple and Waterfall Lane from single family (R-1) to single family (R-2) was denied by Birmingham city commissioners Monday night.

Commissioners rejected the request because they felt the land could be developed in a single family manner.

The owner of the property, Frank Newell, has requested the property be rezoned several times with the first petition dating back to 1947.

City May Change Area from Park To Parking Lot

The city of Birmingham is thinking about going into the leasing business at the corner of Worth and Webster.

Commissioners have instructed the administration to look into the possibility of constructing a parking lot on a small triangular piece of city-owned land at the intersection.
