ator between the medical society and the pharmacists, stated that the pharmacists in Oakland County "are all ready to do their part again with over 150 participants representing almost 75 per cent of the drug stores in this county."

EDGAR J. Geist, Jr., M.D. and John R. Simpson, M.D., coordinators for the MD's and James Powell, D.O., coordinator for the DO's, said all stations will again be manned by physicians—ready to answer any and all questions and to lend a hand for any emergency which might arise.

Mrs. Leonard Fry, representing the public school PTA groups, and Mrs. C. Patrick Quinn, representing the parochial school PTA groups, stated at an organizational meeting that the volunteers at each station have been informed of their duties and it is expected that this meeting will run "most efficiently," making it possible for them to handle from four to eight thousand people.

THE OAKLAND County District Nurses' Association will provide volunteer nurses to each station. Dr. Bookmyer and Henderson said no one will be turned away because of lack of funds. The donation will again be in cents.
