

# Lathrup Congregational Holds Youth Services

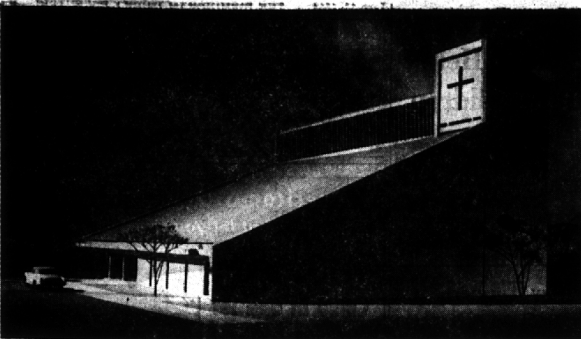

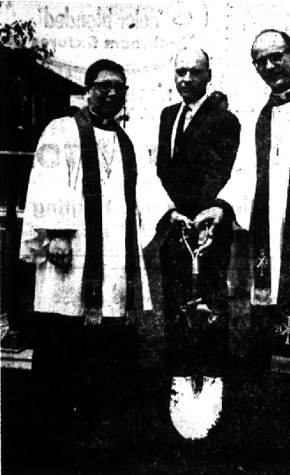
