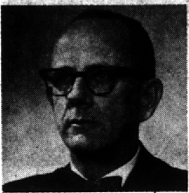


OU Historian Serves On National Committee

Prof. Charles O. Hucker, chairman of the history department and the Asian studies program at Oakland University, has been chosen to serve with nine other scholars on a national committee on Chinese civilization. He and his wife, Myrl, live at 720 W. Long Lake Road, Bloomfield Hills.

Under the auspices of the American Council on Learned Societies, the committee will work to stimulate and coordinate research on traditional Chinese history and culture.

Besides Hucker, a specialist on 16th and 16th century Chinese history, the committee includes scholars from Yale, Harvard, Columbia, Princeton, Chicago, Cornell, the Freer Gallery of Art and the state universities of California and Washington.

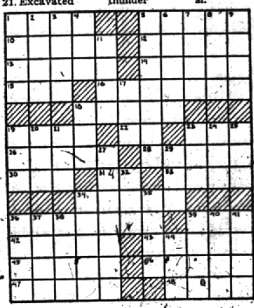
HUCKER is chairman of a subcommittee on Chinese governmental institutions, which is already authorized to conduct a week-long research conference in the summer of 1965.

He was a Rockefeller Foundation postdoctoral fellow in China and Japan from 1952-1954, and has been a consultant on Oriental studies by the U.S. Office of Education and the Ford Foundation. Hucker represented the United States at both the 25th and 26th International Congresses of Orientalists in Moscow in 1960 and in New Delhi in January of this year. He was a director of the Association for Asian Studies in 1960-1963.

HE IS the author of "The Traditional Chinese State in Ming Times," "China: A Critical Bibliography" and articles published in this county and abroad. Since 1956 he has served as a contributing editor of Encyclopaedia Britannica. Hucker joined the Oakland faculty in 1961, after teaching at the universities of Chicago and Arizona.

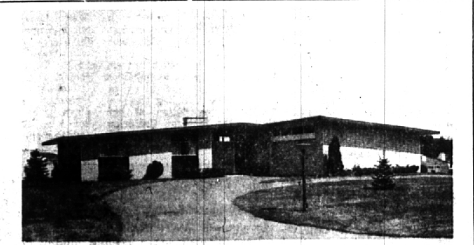
