What to do with the kids all summer, now that school is out, is a problem that has concerned a lot of people. Moms care, of course, but so do the directors of cultural organizations.

The programs they have developed would more than fill this column. So the question becomes not what but which of the many things to do.

When I really think about my children, view them apart from the pellmell rush of everyday living, I try to decide what sort of experiences would make them the sort of people they would like to be.

of basic structure and academic form is necessary, just as organized education is necessary. And much of the pattern or design is predetermined by cultural heritage.

This leaves summer as the ideal time to do a bit of free lance work to add the color and spice of individuality.

First of all, children deserve some free time to do nothing.

The third category of things to do is organized classes.

THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS have summer classes including instrumental music. Children's classes are also offered at The Community House. The Cranbrook Institute of Science has classes in astronomy, birds, other sciences, and exquisite exhibits.

Further classes are available at local day camps, Kingwood, Cranbrook, Echo Park, City and Country, and the YMCA.

Fourth in this batch of ideas for summer is to organize your own

projects. Take a few children out to paint water colors on a beautiful day. Tape a teepee made from old sheets on the floor and let the kids decorate it with crayons. Gather up old bits of lumber and miscellany and make houses or constructions.

OR DIG UP a chunk of clay at a construction site, and the world's future sculptors can mold it by hand and foot. A table set up outside lets the kids paint "modern art" as freely as any abstract expressionist and then you can hose 'em down before they come inside.

They can make stone mosaic patterns imbedded in sand or concrete, saw soft wood or sandstone or alabaster into sculptures, or make flower arrangements for your table.

You can have a family or neighborhood art show. Rules: Anything goes.

Summer is the time to instill some of the nebulous aspects of life: joy of living, the freedom and ability to choose, how people in other communities match and differ from us and an opportunity for self expression.
