

Institute of Science Opens Photo Shows

Three photographic exhibitions will be presented Monday through July 15 at the Cranbrook Institute of Science on Lone Pine Road, Bloomfield Hills.

One hundred photos of "Africa, Antarctica, and The Amazon," by Emil Schulthess will be shown, derived from Schulthess' three books on the areas.

The second exhibit will feature 10 large color photographs of the Alaskan earthquake, prepared by the National Geographic Society. Pictures are by Winfield Parks, National Geographic photographer.

The institute also will offer a traveling photographic show depicting the history of Cranbrook.

PHOTOGRAPHER Schulthess, on his trip to Africa, sought "the other Africa, that which is pushed back hour by hour and day by day." His pictures reveal the enormous contrasts of the continent.

Throughout his trip he recorded the diversity of animal life and the many kinds of human inhabitants.

Schulthess found the Antarctic to be a "world of beautiful form and unreal colors, populated by penguins, scientists in strange costumes, and machines."

He traveled across much of the vast region of Amazonia to photograph the shy people in their en-

vironment, giving new insight into their foreign and little-known world.

SCHULTHESS BEGAN his career as a commercial artist in Zurich and made his name in 1947 with the publication of a photographic essay on the midnight sun in Norway.

The institute will begin new summer hours of 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays on June 15. Hours of week ends are 1 to 5 p.m. There is an admission charge.

Resident Studying In Experimental Program at College

We must admit that there was no system that we know of to arrive at the proper contract, but Ernie displayed his daring and knowledge of bridge, and with some luck arrived at the proper contract and top results. If you remember this hand, did you get as good a result?

BOTH VULNERABLE:
Dealer: West
NORTH (Kay Clinton)
♠ void
♥ 6 4
♦ Q 9 6 5 2
♣ J 7 4 3 2

WEST (Dealer) EAST
♠ K Q J 10 6 5 4 2 ♠ 9 8 7
♥ 9 ♣ K 2

SOUTH (Ernest Clinton)

The bidding:
WEST NORTH EAST SOUTH
4 ♠ Pass Pass 6 ♣
Double All pass

Opening lead: K ♠
Ernie was all set to await three passes, then open this hand at two hearts, but was he ever surprised at the pre-empt opening by West! He knew that there were four possible losers, but he was going for all or for broke.

Ernie ruffed the opening lead of the king of spades and a low trump and took the hook. Next he played the ace of diamonds and then his four of diamonds.

West was obliged to win with the king and found the best return of the queen of spades. Ernie did not get careless and allow the queen to run to his ace but did ruff this return of the spade. He then discarded his queen of clubs on the queen of diamonds for 12 tricks and the top board.

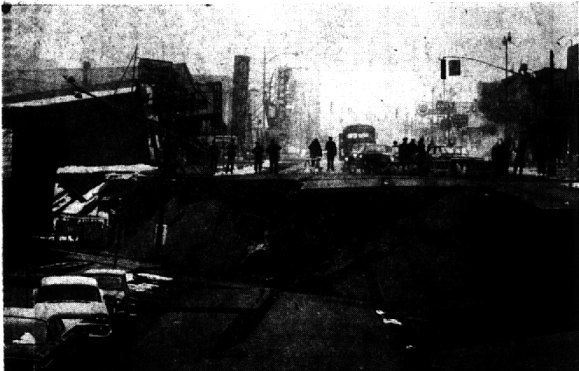
