

# B'ham Congregational Church Schedules Vacation School

The Board of Christian Education of the Congregational Church of Birmingham has scheduled its Vacation school to be held each morning from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. from July 6 through July 17. Classes will be held for children who have completed 8-year-nursery through those who have completed Public school kindergarten at the church, 388 N. Woodward. The classes for all school age children through 6 grade will be held at Woodbrook House (the new church property) at the corner of Woodward and Cranbrook.

**THE CURRICULUM** material chosen by the Board of Christian Education will be the Cooperative Series which is prepared by many denominations working together and is published by the Division of Christian Education of the National Council of Churches.

Planned and written by leaders with wide experience in working with boys and girls, the curriculum is designed to help teachers use fully the special advantages offered by the Vacation Church School.

The series is subject to a continuing process of evaluation and study in order that it may give increasingly effective help. Most of the texts are accompanied by books or packets of material for use by the pupils.

IN ADDITION to the program of study, special activities in the field of creative arts and crafts, music, drama and recreation will be provided. The study theme is "The Life and Teachings of Jesus" and includes stories of Jesus' life and His ministry.

## B'field Pathologist Reboards HOPE

Returning to the S.S. HOPE for his third tour of duty, Dr. E. M. Knights boarded the hospital ship in Quayside, Ecuador this week. He will return to Providence Hospital in July. The HOPE is a 100-bed teaching, clinical and surgical floating hospital converted from the Navy hospital ship U.S.S. Consolation. Dr. Knights headed the team of physicians who organized the ship's pathology department for its Peruvian mission in 1962.

IN 1965, African Guinea will be the first African nation to be the first African nation visited by the HOPE and the pathologist from Bloomfield Hills. Dr. Knights resides at 5153 Echo Road with his wife, a nurse whom he met three years ago during the HOPE's Indonesian visit. A local campaign is underway this month to raise \$500,000 for Project HOPE. William Gershenson of Birmingham is general chairman. The local quota is one-tenth of the national goal for HOPE.

Gershenson said regarding Dr. Knights' departure for Quayside, "Providence Hospital is making a signal contribution to Project HOPE by sending their chief pathologist. Dr. Knights is indeed a medical diplomat."
