Hey Kids! Guess who is going to be at the Southfield Fair this year. None other than one of your favorite TV personalities, MORGUS. He will be at the Fair July 3, 4, and 5 at 4, 6, 8, and 10 p.m. It looks like MORGUS is brewing a lot of surprises for one and all.

Plans are currently being processed for the fifth annual Southfield Fair, a joint venture between civic and business organizations in the community. Proceeds from the fair go entirely for community activities in Southfield.

The fair will be held at the Southfield High School grounds at 10 Mile and Lasher roads. The hours will be 5 p.m. to midnight, July 2; noon to midnight, July 3; and 10 a.m. to midnight, July 4 and 5.

Approximately 25,000 persons

viewed the fair last year and the figure is expected to double this year. The mayor of Southfield and the superintendent of the school board will officiate at the opening day ribbon-cutting ceremonies.

AMONG THOSE with exhibits at the fair will be the Southfield fire department, Southfield Civil Defense, Southfield police department and the Southfield Park and Recreation department have plans for running races and games with prizes.

The U.S. Army will show a demonstration of mechanized equipment; the U.S. Navy will have a scale model of the Polaris Missile on display and the U.S. Air Force will display a scale model of the X-15.

Other exhibitors will be the League of Women Voters, American Red Cross, Oakland County Sheriff's Department, Michigan State Police, Southern Michigan Tourists Association, local news-

papers and an art exhibit with commercial artists drawing on-the-spot sketches.

THE SPECIAL activities include square dancing under the stars on July 3 and 4 from 8 to 11 p.m. Callers will be Norm Hill and Dave Taylor.

A band concert by the Franklin Band, kiddie and teenage rides by Judy Ann Shows, a cake baking contest, Southfield Civil Air Squadron Dress Parade and helicopter rides with special rates for the children.
