This Back-Strap weaving will be demonstrated by Mrs. Fred Stichel and Mrs. Arthur Hagman.

Some of the other demonstrations will be cut glass mosaic tiling by Gloria Rohak; copper enameling by Marge Ellison; egg painting, according to an old Ukrainian custom by J. Orks; and china painting by Mildred Ziegler of the Cottage Shop in Troy, Alice Clos and Elsie Richman, all of whom have had their designs illustrated in "China Decorator," a trade magazine.

VISITORS MAY also see candies being made on antique molds from the Detroit Historical Museum by Mrs. Donald Siefaff and Mrs. Robert Brandon. One of the most unusual demonstrations will be x-ray photography by George Jackson of Rochester.

Many of these handicrafts will be for sale at the festival.

As an extra attraction for children who visit the festival, Hercules, of CKLW-TV, will appear in costume at 2:30 p.m. Saturday to give autographs.

3 New Approaches To Teach Reading Tested in County

Fourteen Oakland County school districts will share a \$80,000 Federal grant next year in an effort to demonstrate that good teachers can teach children to read effectively regardless of the approach used.

In announcing the terms of the U.S. Office of Education grant, Dr. Harry T. Hahn, director of instruction of Oakland Schools, said three different ways of teaching reading will be tested in each of the districts.

"There will be new elements in each of the three approaches," he said. "A major weakness in previous testing of classroom practices is that one teacher has been given new methods and materials while another has been asked to teach as usual and serve as a control. The new technique almost always wins because of the teacher's enthusiasm in doing something different."

Adrienne M. Serbine, 24710 Renaissance, Oak Park, has been selected as one of 51 participants at the University of Arizona's NDEA Spanish Institute in Guadalajara, Mexico.

Miss Serbine teaches Spanish at Seaholm High School.

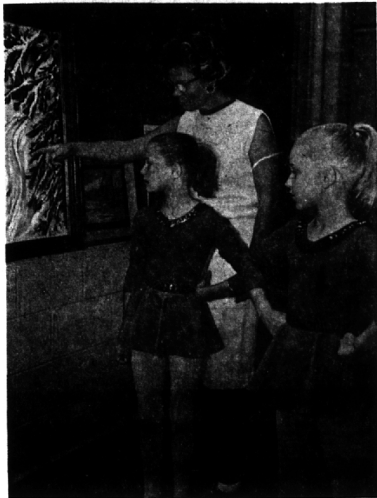

Art Teacher Sets Children's Workshop

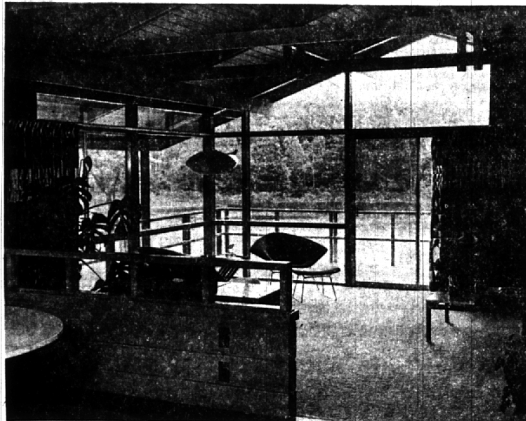

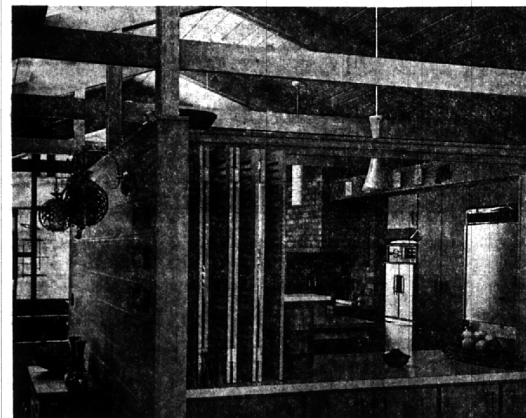

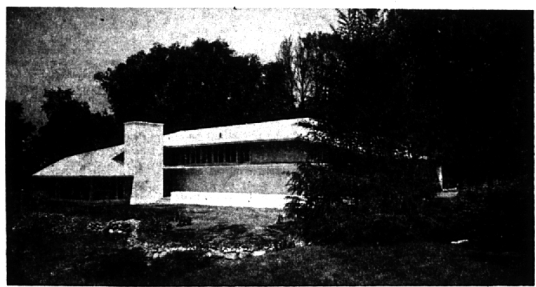
