

### A Forgotten Landmark

The pedestrian underpass beneath Hunter Blvd. near Oak has almost been forgotten by Birmingham residents. Built in 1938 by the state highway department, the 184foot tunnel is seldom used. Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley said that although there has never been a report of a crime in the tunnel parents generally are afraid to allow their children to use it. About the only visitors to the 8-foot wide, 71%-foot high tunnel are the DPW maintenance crews.
