Northwest Unitarian Hears Mrs. Sobell

Mrs. Helen Sobell, wife of Morton Sobell, now serving a 30-year prison sentence on a conviction of conspiring to commit espionage, spoke on the 11-year-old case at Northwest Unitarian-Universalist Church Friday.

With Mrs. Sobell was Dr. Erwin Gaede, minister of the Ann Arbor Unitarian Church. A film was shown that proposed to show why the case is not closed.

It was on June 19, 1953, that Ethel and Julius Rosenberg were executed at Sing Sing prison after having been convicted on charges of conspiring to commit espionage. At the same trial Morton Sobell was sentenced to 30 years imprisonment and David Greenglass to 15 years.

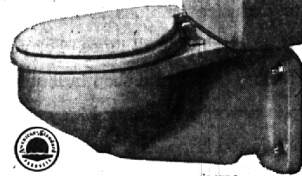
Sunday church school is at 8:30 a.m., and family worship is at 9:15 a.m. in the Poppleton School, Big Beaver and Crooks, Troy.
