B'ham Altrusas Hold Installation

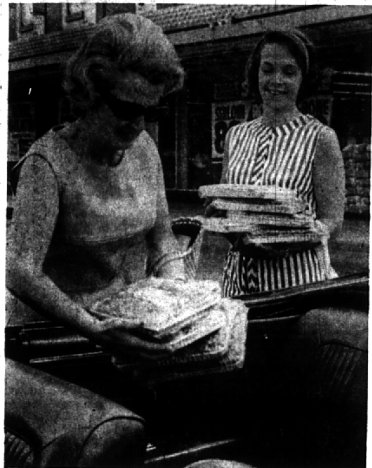
