When Southern Michigan Bridge Association made the announcement that it would conduct a knock-out-team-of-four tournament I decided at once to see if I could obtain a partner and Jack Malstrom on my team.

As events turned out, I was able to obtain them for my team, and my hand for today will show how fortunate I was in obtaining them.

Inasmuch as this team event is decided on total points, rather than board a match, this hand was a big swing for us.

At my table, the East player wanted to make seven diamond tricks and one heart trick at no trump, so we arrived at a three-no-trump contract and were unable to bring in the contract.

Phyllis Malstrom, seated West, not only arrived at four spades, which she could make, but then got off to the best lead against five hearts, doubled.

The lead of the four of clubs was won in dummy with the queen, and declarer cashed the ace of spades and discarded a diamond. On a trump lead, Jack Malstrom jumped up with the ace and played the ace and king of diamonds.
