

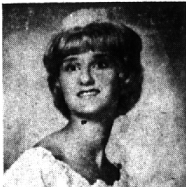
### Bermuda-Bound Honeymooners

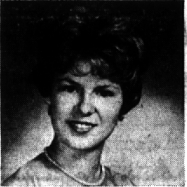
