face of the last remaining large pile while wrapping it for us. Expressing his regret, he refused to sell it to us but will send us the next pile completed to his satisfaction.

Leaving El Morro National Monument in the Zuni Indian Reservation near Gallup, N. M., we suddenly came upon a large herd of goats which covered the hill top.

THE BABY GOATS, not yet branded, looked like soft, stuffed toys. El Morro's white sandstone bluffs bear early Indian petroglyphs and names of Spanish explorers seeking the seven cities of Cibola and later of travelers who refreshed themselves at the rock-rimmed pool which holds rain water.

Cottonwood Campground at Canyon de Chelly National Monument on the Navajo Indian Reservation is a real oasis in this starkly beautiful desert land.

We viewed many cliff dwelling ruins and photographs on a half-day trip up into Canyon de Chelly and interesting Canyon de Muerdo. Navajo Fortress, a huge sandstone formation, was the site of the Navajo's last stand against the government before Kit Carson defeated them with his scorched earth policy which led to the famed Navajo Long March.

AT THE campground Leigh and I washed three days of dust out of our hair and Phil changed a going-flat tire while Suzz and Craig mixed water and dirt to build miniature kivas.

The white fluff from the cottonwood trees practically covered the ground. Conversing with other campers and at the evening campfire slide program, we learned much about the many problems facing the Navajo today as he undertakes to blend two widely differing cultures.

Common sights as we proceeded to Navajo National Monument were Indian hogans and summer homes, horse-pulled wagons and sheep-herders on horse back.

Here we camped at 7,000 feet, and it was a little chilly when we awoke in the morning. Accompanied by a park ranger, we hiked a mile and a half into Tsagii Canyon to reach Betanikta ruin, Hill-side House.

AFTER DINNER Phil and I watched a magnificent sunset from Messenger Overlook while the children ground pieces of sandstone against the rock slabs into coils, arrowheads and circle shapes.

Navajo construction workers, with their hair braided and wrapped in white cloth, were entering the canyon to work on the new Mission 66 hiking trail as we took a last morning look before driving out on a rocky road heavily drifted with sand.

The primitive road to Shonto Trading Post, where we bought a Shonto pattern rug, was liberally strewn with empty pop cans. The Indians buy pop by the carton, and it is almost a staple in their diet.

OUR NEXT day's drive took us through Monument Valley and Navajo Tribal Park, where weird sandstone formations rise up from the valley floor, and on to the Goose Necks, where the San Juan River twists in a double "S" shape.

Here the children climbed part way down the steep canyon walls. Scarce items in this vast desert country are block ice and camping gear with water and trees. Plentiful items are dust and sun.

The local sheriff guided us to a wooded campsite on the bank of the San Juan near Bluff, Utah, where a retired oil millionaire gave Craig and Suzz their first fishing experience. Catch was four catfish in 15 minutes.

THE CHILDREN scampered up a sheer cliff and then experienced considerable difficulty maintaining their footing on the way down. They rearranged a sandbar in the river to form islands and channels.

At our motel in Flagstaff, Ariz., we had our first catastrophe. The children were cleaned of five days of desert dust and ready for a swim when I remembered their swimsuits were in the trunk which Phil had taken to have thoroughly washed, greased and tires rotated.

An SOS to the motel secured a driver who drove us along a metal-gas station lined US 89 where we spotted our car atop a grease rack.

SWIMSUITS USED, four loads of clothes washed and dried, hair washed and set, children sent to dinner in the coffee shop and Phil, minus a four day's growth of beard, and I, in heels and a dress, enjoyed a leisurely steak dinner.

This morning, while the children swam, another dip in the pool which has a slide, Phil has taken our Hellie tent-trailer to Cave Spring Campground in nearby Oak Creek Canyon to set up our base camp for the next few days.
