

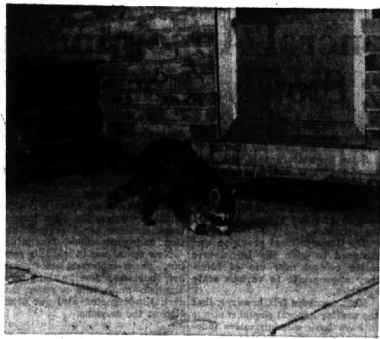

 ifications were to be established on a state level.
 "When a department, say, in Northern Michigan where there is a manpower shortage wanted a new officer, he could possibly be selected from the Detroit area," Moxley said.
 He added that this in no way was a step toward the creation of a metropolitan type police force such as in Los Angeles and stressed that each department would continue to operate on its own.

ACTIVE IN police work since 1941, Moxley began his 17th year as Birmingham chief last Wednesday. He came to Birmingham

as chief from Ypsilanti where he was a detective sergeant.
 He has taken advance police work at the Institute of Applied Science in Chicago, is a graduate of the FBI National Academy in Washington and the Police Administration Course at Northwestern University.
 He is a member of the South-eastern Michigan Chiefs of Police, the International Police Chiefs Association and the South Oakland County Law Enforcement Agency.
 Moxley was also one of the founders of the southeastern Michigan Basic Police Training School that has been copied by law enforcement agencies throughout the state.

"I'm trying to preserve the home I live in," Braun said. "Mr. Pulte appears to feel no moral obligation, but only stays within his legal rights."

In view of the litigation, approval of the plan was postponed until the outcome of the case.

At the request of the residents, the council directed Village Manager Robert E. Murphy to notify the five residents whenever Georgetown Green comes up on the agenda.

A SECOND request by Pulte for tentative approval of the plan for Georgetown Green No. 2 failed by a tie vote. The council wants to see a second entrance guaranteed for the subdivision but the south end of it lies in the village of Bingham Farms.

Since the village of Beverly Hill's has no jurisdiction over it, they did not want to approve the plan until the road was assured.

When the motion failed, the village manager was instructed to contact officials in Bingham Farms and discuss with them what the possibilities were.

Another request for approval on the night's long agenda also failed. A request to subsidize lotg in Fairfield Villa subdivision near Fairfax Road brought the response that the previous decision of the council remains unchanged, and underground drains are required.

A request for approval of Valley Woods subdivision was granted.

IN OTHER business, a public hearing was held to hear objections to the construction of water mains in Nottingham Forrest numbers 1 and 2. A petition of 64 1/2 per cent of the residents started the action.

The mains will cost \$64,554.05, which \$37,716 will be special assessment, and the remainder will be paid by the village at large. Plans will be reviewed for the assessment roll at a public hearing to be held at 8 p.m. Aug. 3 in the village hall.

The permit issued to fill the Cleo Pulte property, 13 1/2 Mile east of Lasher was cancelled to allow the situation to be reviewed.

SEVERAL WATER main issues were on the agenda. An ordinance to amend the water ordinance was passed to provide payment of the mains on Pierce and Sheridan. The total cost without interest is \$38,18, but it can be paid on the water bill in eight quarterly installments.

The request for a water connection to the Apostolic Christian Church, 19400 West 13 Mile, was granted with charges of \$1,433.95, but the church's request for installment payments was not approved. However, the council said if they wish to propose a case for hardship, they will listen to it.

The council also requested the City of Southfield to ask their residents being served by the village water department to either terminate the service being given residents of their city by the village, or remit to the village the sum of \$38.18 for each resident.

U-M Clinic Welcomes Troubled Children

Billy is an intelligent but overly aggressive 10-year-old, yet his work is on a par with an average second grader.
 Susan, age 10, does fairly well academically, but is constantly nervous and fearful of other children.
 These two youngsters, whose behavior is so different from typical fifth graders, are among 30 inpatients attending an unusual school in the Children's Psychiatric Hospital at The University of Michigan Medical Center.
 Here Billy and Susan get daily classroom instruction. Billy receives additional remedial help, and both are encouraged to participate in extra-curricular activities.

Like most schools, CPH has a "principal." He is James W. Marshall, recently promoted to the position after serving as assistant principal since August 1962.
 A teacher by profession, Marshall says he's "always worked with children or adults who have had problems with emotional and social adjustment."
 He taught special classes in a Plymouth high school for four years and has served as a rehabilitation counselor in a correction camp. But because he wanted "a more childlike atmosphere," he came back to the U-M Medical Center in 1962, where he'd previously worked part-time.
 According to Marshall, classroom grouping is an initial hurdle at CPH School. A new patient is placed in a particular class on the basis of age, achievement level, remedial needs and the nature and extent of his emotional problems.
 He is taught by a teacher trained in the education of emotionally dis-
