NEW ATAC Chief Named

Colonel John B. Scott has been named chief of the Plans and Commodity Office of the Warrenton-based Army Tank-Automotive Center (ATAC). He resides at 1798 Maryland Blvd., Birmingham.

In making the announcement, Brigadier General B. J. Leon Hershorn, commanding general of ATAC, said Col. Scott will direct the activities of the installation's Plans, International Logistics and Weapon Systems Division.

Born in Philadelphia, Pa., Col. Scott was graduated from Drexel Institute of Technology, Phila., with a bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering and received a Masters degree in business administration from the University of Chicago.

COL. SCOTT comes to ATAC from the U. S. Army Materiel Command where he served as chief of the Development and Engineering Division.

In 1944 Col. Scott and a fellow officer published a comprehensive three-volume reference which covered all categories of Ordnance service support material and training. More than 50,000 copies of the field guide were sold with all the proceeds going to the Army Emergency Relief Fund.

YOUR GARDEN CENTER NOW THAT

Our little ones have gone back to Libya after a lovely visit with us in Birmingham we can get back to Brass tacks . . .

Such as

1. POISON IVY—and there seems to be a lot of it, apparently. Spray with AMINO TRIAZOLE. Read the instructions! DO NOT spray around fruit trees.
2. SAND BOX SAND—Delivered at no charge (the sand costs you \$1.00 per bag of 100 lbs., plus or minus.)
3. CABBAGE WORMS & LOOPERS. They love cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, brussel sprouts and collards even if you don't.

Use DDT until the heads begin to form. After that use the MALATHION or METHOXYCHLOR at 7 day intervals—BUT—STOP 10 days before harvest.

4. Some of your flowers need as much support as you do.
METAL PLANT-PROPS 12" to 6'
BAMBOO PLANT PROPS 2' to 6'
CYPRESS STAKES 4'-5' and 6'

5. As soon as the yard & garden are in good shape (or even before that time), set yourself up with the MOST in Barbecue Grills—a CHAR-BROIL GRILL. This is not only a status item, it is a well-designed, rugged cooker that will give you years of sublime eating and entertainment possibilities. Broil, Smoke & Burn!

6. SCALE SPRAYS—You MUST take care of this now. Use ISOTOX or DD-IDE at weekly intervals for 3 weeks. MOST of the scales are on the UNDERSIDE of the branches.

7. FRUIT THINNING—Overloading the trees is pretty but not good for the crop. HERE'S HOW:
Apples:— 8 to 12" between fruits
Peaches:— 8 to 10" between fruits
Plums:—So they do not touch at harvest time.
Pears:—Remove one wherever doubles occur.
Remember that when 12 pigs are on a 6 pig trough none of them get fat.

8. IDENTIFY your ESTATE with a WHITEHALL SIGN for trees, mail box or lawn. With or without ornament—names or numbers or both. Takes about a week to identify your estate.
