Glass Made First

Glassmaking was America's first industry. In 1608, a glass factory was started in the Jamestown settlement in Virginia, to produce glass beads for trade with the Indians, drinking glasses and bottles for the colonists' own needs and other glassware, which was sent back to England.

Pruning branches from the lowest 17 feet of a 15-year-old pine tree can mean about \$10 in added returns when the tree is harvested for lumber, a Michigan State University forester says. Pruning removes branches from a tree stem so wood added in future years will have no knots.
