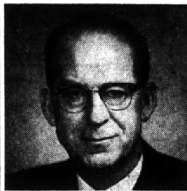

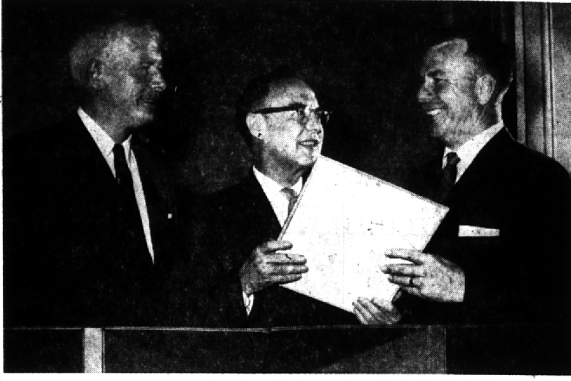
scoring. The shots I make can only be returned in a certain way so I know where to position myself.

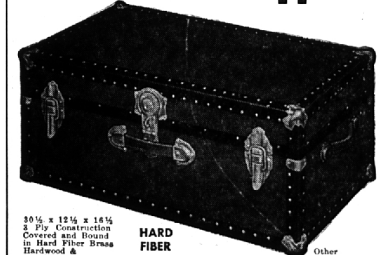
