Plan Seminar On Unifying Traffic Devices

LANSING—The first of a series of statewide workshops will be held this week in Birmingham on the State Highway Department's new Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

The Birmingham meeting will be Thursday at the City Hall.

Purpose of the workshops is to review the new manual which incorporates the latest uniform standards adopted in 1961 by the American Association of State Highway Officials (AASHO).

THE MEETING this week is the first of about 40 to 50 planned throughout the state. It will be attended by local officials responsible for traffic control devices.

The meeting will be opened by Richard Gare, city manager. Also speaking will be Sgt. Michael Bihl of the Michigan State Police, Oakland County Sheriff Frank W. Irons, Highway Department District Traffic Engineer Samuel Levine and Hebert Crane, District Cool and Waldon Borton, Highway Department traffic engineers.

The Uniform Traffic Control Device Manual, first published by the Michigan State Highway Department in 1939, is an effort to make uniform the design and use of all traffic control devices in Michigan.

sign ordinance and the dog ordinance. Two bills received were \$2,150 and \$2,250.

A program to seal-coat certain roads at a total cost of \$8,827 was approved. Advertising for bids for the roads which will include parts of Church, Cranbrook, Orchard Ridge, Linda Lane and Linda Court, will begin immediately.

The council also authorized a higher figure for work to be done on an arched pipe over the Rouge River at Cranbrook Court. The original authorization of \$1,500 proved to be inadequate, as the

COHEN ASSURED the commission the commercial development would run only from Maple to Yorkshire and for the record "it would not be extended into the block between Yorkshire and Buckingham."

The Pembroke Association suggested that the commission might consider constructing a solid divider strip along the length of Coolidge from Maple to Big Beaver.

This would prevent automobiles from turning onto the east-west streets that are in Birmingham.

Another suggestion by the group called for the construction of a service or access drive along Coolidge in Birmingham and the entire main roadway would be located in Troy.

COMMISSIONER William H. Burgum said that no matter what plan for the Coolidge improvement was adopted he felt that truck traffic should be kept off the road.

"We don't want heavy trucks from the industrial area south of Maple shooting up there to gain entrance to the I-75 freeway," Burgum said. "They should be routed over to Crooks Road."

Mayor Pro Tem Robert W. Page said he was concerned about the share of the cost property owners in Birmingham might have to pay

Normally when such improvements are made the cost is split 75 per cent to the property owner and 25 per cent to the City.

Page said he felt the city-at-large should pay a bigger share of the cost because Coolidge is a major road.
