Central Plaza Development of Canton, Ohio, which recently brought an "Award of Merit" from the American Institute of Architects to Tarapata-MacMahon Associates, Inc., of Bloomfield Hills, is recognized as a milestone in urban planning in the use of a mall combined with buildings for civic use to revitalize the central city. The AIA jury, in presenting the award to the local corporation

of architects, engineers and planners, noted: "A creative, inexpensive demonstration of how a typical main street can be transformed into an exciting, human environment. This project is a rare example of a central plaza designed for people in the heart of an automobile city. It should serve to encourage other cities to imitate its example."

State Motorists Make 400 'Moon Trips' Daily

Today, as man sets his sights on the moon—and beyond—his earth-bound movements seem to shrink almost into insignificance. But for all but a handful of people, travel will remain tied to this planet for many decades to come. The approximately 239,000-mile journey through outer space to the moon will be an awesome voyage indeed.

BUT IMPRESSIVE too is the fact that daily highway travel in Michigan totals more than 400 times that distance—approximately 100 million miles a day. Last year, vehicles of all types traveled more than 36 billion miles over highways and streets in Michigan.

Certainly travel through outer space and travel on highways have little in common. But while the average driver needs little scientific or technical training, the astronaut can take some satisfaction in the fact that at least he has no traffic problems.
