An audience with Pope Paul on Saturday will be one highlight of his European trip for Paul D. Cabrooke, son of the Paul Cabrookes of Bryn Mawr Road.

A 1961 graduate of the University of Detroit, Paul is an English teacher at Barnum Junior High. He and a friend, Frank Cuncich, who is a Detroit physical education teacher, flew to London June 28, where they picked up a Triumph in which they are touring the continent. Their itinerary includes France, Belgium, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Italy, Spain, England, Scotland and Ireland.

They will fly back to the States Sept. 2, and spend a few days at the World's Fair before returning to Michigan. This is Paul's first trip to Europe.

# Newlyweds To Live in Connecticut



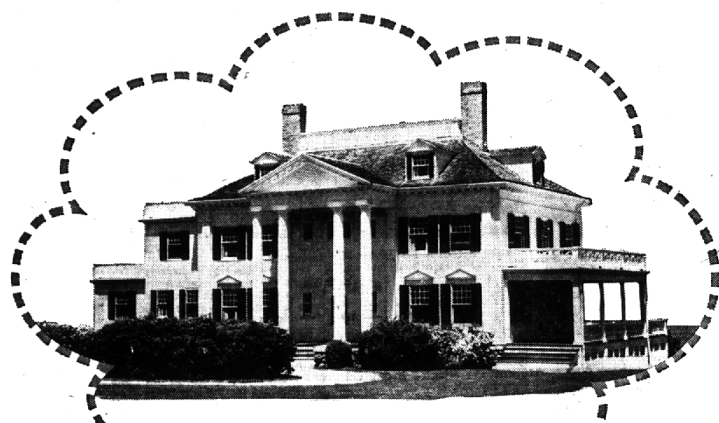

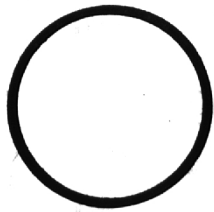
