

Seventh Annual B'ham Community Tennis Tournament

- The Birmingham Community tennis tournament, co-sponsored by the Birmingham Eccentric and the Birmingham Recreation Department, will be held July 25 to August 2.
- The tournament is for players in the City and District of Birmingham. It will be played in 19 divisions.
- An entry fee of \$1 for the men's and women's divisions and \$2 for the boys and girls divisions will be charged. Fees must be paid at the courts the first day of play. All players must report to the first match with one can of new balls.
- Trophies will be awarded winners and runners-up in each division.
- This form should be filled out and mailed to the Recreation Department, Municipal Building or taken to Eton Park weekdays from 8-8 p.m. Entries must be in the Recreation Office by noon July 24.
- Players can compete in both singles and doubles in the adult divisions. Boys and girls may enter one division only.
- IMPORTANT: In doubles, both players must make out individual slips. These must be attached and mailed in together. For singles, each player must send in another form.

- 4 p.m. Senior boys and girls (17 and under)

State Police Caution Careless Swimmers

Emphasizing that Michigan water deaths have already hit the 100 mark, the State Police cautioned against carelessness in water sports activities, now reaching peak summer volume.

The toll for the first six months exceeded by 17 the 83 drownings for the same period a year ago while the provisional total of 144 accidents was 16 higher. At least 33 have been injured compared with 45 in the first half of 1963.

Lack of proper precautions for water safety was noted as Michigan experienced an upsurge of drownings during the latter part of June.

Katie set the new 50-meter breaststroke record at an even 32 seconds, while Mike made pool history in the 50-meter freestyle event with a time of 37.2 seconds.

IN THE SEVEN and eight-year-old division, July Rempal took first place in the 50-meter freestyle event in 30.7 seconds.

Richard Baker won the 50-meter freestyle and Mike Boyd took first place in the breaststroke event in the nine and ten year group.

Joan Mattice won the breaststroke competition in both the 13 and 14-year-old and 15 and 16-year-old divisions with times of 42.9 and 42.4 seconds for 100 meters.

Of the 15 and 16-year-olds, Laurel Beauvois and Larry Dising won against Pleasant Ridge at Pleasant Ridge Road and 10 Mile starting at 6:30 p.m.
