## First Methodist Lab School Trains Nursery Teachers

For the past two weeks, First Methodist Church of Birmingham has sponsored a nursery laboratory school for three-year-old boys and girls.

The school, which has been meeting Monday through Friday, lasts from 9:30 to 11:30 each morning.

The laboratory school is an experience in which parents and teachers work with a laboratory teacher as she works with a certain age group.

THE TEACHER is conscious of the fact that she is teaching two groups at the same time, both the parents and teachers, and the children.

The theme for the two-week nursery school has been "God's Summer Time World" with stories, games, rhythms and creative activities originating around the theme. Children are not forced to participate if they do not desire.

Some of the most interesting activities employed in the laboratory school are finger painting, soap painting, sponge painting, rhythmic record interpreting, finger plays, group games and a toy orchestra.

All activities are planned to enrich the church school on Sunday mornings. Many of the teachers who have been taking the training will become involved in working with two and three-year-olds in the coming year.
