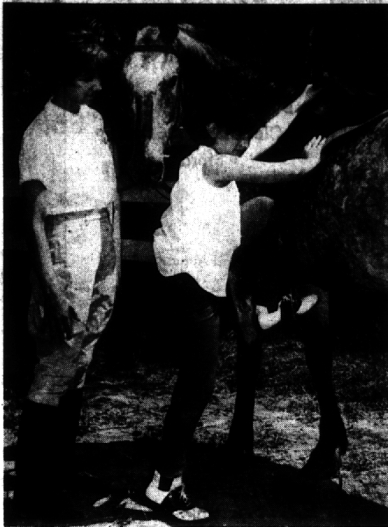


Local Campers Summer At Cavell
