

ession of a number of letters written to Dr. Clarke something like a prospector ever seeing the elusive vein of gold, except that the doctor's finds have probably been more rewarding. His treasure hunting has ranged from donations to the purchase of a prized collection, such as the Campau family papers.

The library also possesses one of the best collections in Michigan on the colorful Beaver Island Mormon colony, which was led by King James Jesse Strang. Included is a rare tiny type of Elvira Field, Strang's first polygamous wife.

THERE ARE MANY other rare, one-in-existence items: Indian language books written in French and newspaper collections. In fact, the library has the only complete file in existence of that old Pontiac newspaper, The Press Gazette, which was founded in 1843 and published until 1914 when new owners renamed it the Pontiac Daily Press.

The existence of the library is not as widely known as it should be. The university extends an invitation to "young men and women interested in their historical heritage and to the scholar involved in historical research to visit and use the Clarke Historical Library in light of their individual needs and interests."

The key word at the 115th annual Michigan State Fair is "free". Nearly all the entertainment can be seen at no extra admission charge. The fair opens Friday, Aug. 28, and runs through Monday, Sept. 7.
