Bea Hutton pulled down honors in A flight, while Sandy Moll, with the aid of a birdie on No. 8, captured B flight.

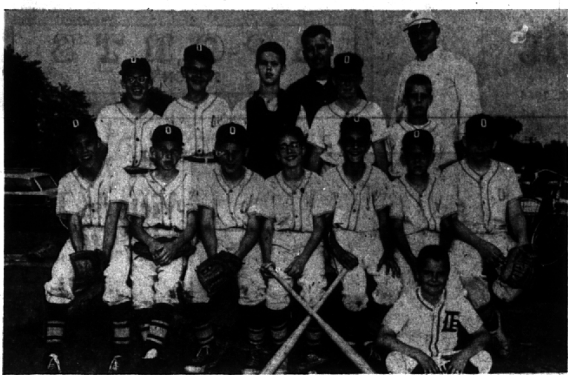

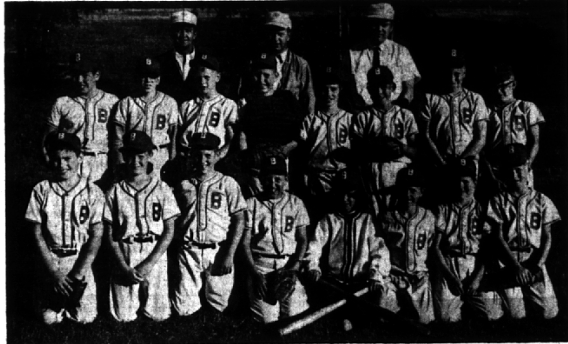
