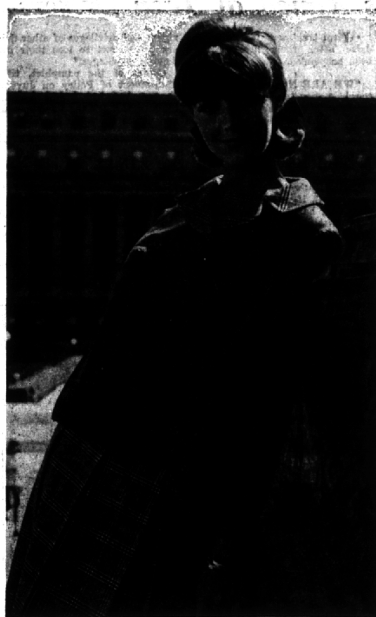

Circuit Court Post Sought by Pontiac Lawyer

Gordon S. Smith, Pontiac attorney for 13 years, will run for judge of Circuit Court in Oakland County. Smith, 37, a partner in the firm of Utley, Smith and Kohn, has been a resident of Oakland County for 30 years.

In declaring his bid for the Circuit Court post, Smith emphasized his varied legal experience.

"Knowledge of the law and of human relationships comes only from constant contact with people in the courts," Smith explained.

"The administration of equal and reasoned judgment must be rooted in a profound knowledge of and compassion for the problems and aspirations of people from all walks of life."

SMITH IS a graduate of the Detroit College of Law and a member of the Oakland County Bar Association and the Michigan State Bar. He served for several years on the budget committee of the United Foundation.

As one of the prime movers in the formation of Oakland County Senior Citizens and Retirees groups, Smith has maintained an active interest in legal and pension problems affecting older age groups. Smith is also allied with Homeowner and Subdivision groups in civic and legal aspects of the rapidly expanding out-county area.

Children's Hospital: Aimed for the Young

Children's Hospital of Michigan, a Torch Drive agency, cared for 24 Birmingham children as inpatients and three others at its clinics during the past year.

Children's is a voluntary non-profit hospital under a board of trustees who volunteer their services.

Last year, Children's provided 68,248 patient days service to 8,858 patients whose average stay was 7.7 days. On an average day, there were 187 patients in 215 beds.

It is staffed by 300 physicians who are specialists in the care of children, and 50 full-time residents who are completing their required training. These doctors devote their time to patient care, teaching and research.

"ON THE SPOT" medical training for medical students attending the Wayne State University School of Medicine is provided at Children's. Wayne professors and associate professors in pediatrics, surgery for children, and research in children's diseases carry full-time staff assignments at Children's Hospital. About 80 physicians from Children's also hold faculty appointments at Wayne.

All patients up to 12 years of age who need its services are admitted to Children's Hospital, whether or not they can pay. Two-thirds of the in-patients at Children's have insurance or other means to pay most of all of their hospital bills. One-third are eligible for State Aid. Only two per cent have no resources.

IN THE CLINICS, the situation is reversed. Only two per cent pay the full rate. Another 75 per cent pay something, and 23 per cent receive help from Aid to Dependent Children or Welfare.

The hospital receives no payment at all from either the County or the State for Outpatient care. Clinics are held covering a wide range of ailments.

Last year, services were held on ear, nose and throat, orthopedic, premature, dermatology, rheumatic fever, speech, fracture, allergy, cardiology, cystic fibrosis, nephrosis, neurosurgical, physical therapy, hematology, dental, medical, surgical, emergency, dispensary, cleft palate, diabetes, eye, endocrine, psychological and seizure, audiograms, cast, cerebral palsy, chest, gastrointestinal, neurology, respiratory.

IT IS TO make sure that sick and injured children may receive needed care regardless of ability to pay that Torch Drive dollars are made available.

the modern surgical and medical services possible, it sees to the happiness of its patients by creating an atmosphere of relaxed sociability and avoiding restrictions as much as possible.
