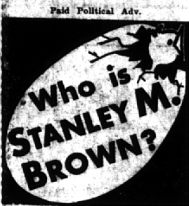

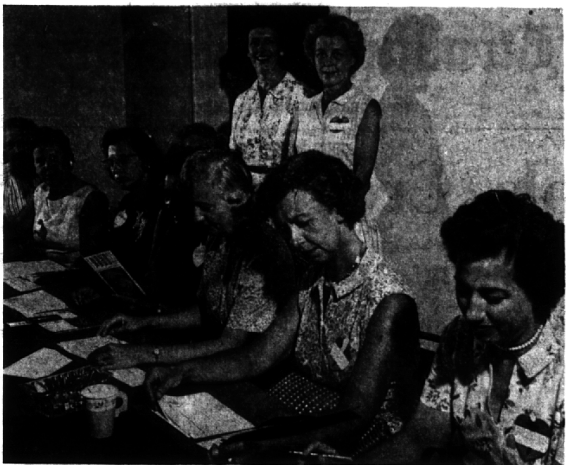


B'ham Army Lt. Trains Officers, Assists Operations

Lowe is a 1960 graduate of Birmingham Seaholm High School and received his B.A. degree in 1964 from Michigan State University.

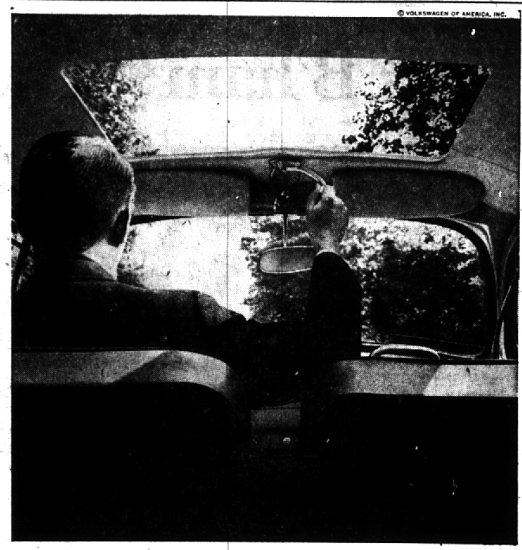


Birmingham Women Study Heart

- Worthwhile Notes**
- CRABGRASS**—Heavy infestations should be killed now so that:
 - The seeds will not become ripened
 - The dead plants can be raked out in late August, in order to
 - Make room for light fall seeding. When infestation is light and scattered it is recommended that you continue to mow, water and feed properly and use a **PRE-EMERGENCE CRABGRASS CONTROL**, before May 1st, 1964.
 - As soon as **BLEEDING HEART** foliage becomes unsightly cut it off and burn it.
 - Trash Baskets—45c Trash Burners \$3.29 to \$13.95
 - Cut out late afternoon and night watering of lawns. It is N. G. and promotes fungus problems.

President Johnson's refusal to aid in the "investigation" of Bobby Baker, certainly adds no moralistic lustre to the former guide and mentor of now-rich Bobby. A mere telephone call to the chairman of the Senatorial committee that "white-washed" the Bobby Baker scandal would have brought far different results. What a bluish upon the United States Senators who have, by silence and/or hogwash, washed their hands of the nasty affair. It will require a new and more dedicated breed of men and women to restore the U.S. Senate in the trusting hearts of millions of disillusioned Americans.

This reported that President Lyndon B. Johnson, when he was first elected to the Congress, almost had to hitch-hike to Washington—his pocketbook was then not bulging with money. Now he and his Lady Bird are worth many millions. (Certainly that fellow Bobby Baker didn't do so badly either.)

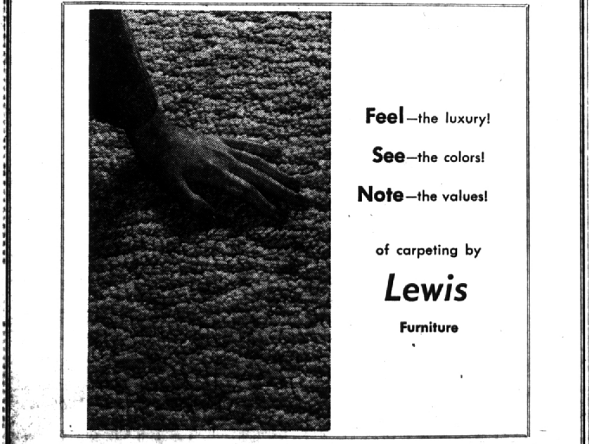
