## Mrs. Romney Speaks to Nation's Youth

Mrs. George Romney addressed the 1,182 youth attending the Moral Reform Conference for Tomorrow's America, July 29 at Mackinac Island. The conference ensemble led by the Livonia High School band sang a special song in her honor called "Michigan."

Mrs. Romney congratulated the youth on "the spirit" she felt at the conference. She told them that at a time when America is the most affluent nation in the world, with the greatest technical knowledge, we have lost "our moral overtones which were the base of the greatness of this nation."

SHE URGED the youth present, who come from every section of the nation, to regain the spirit of sacrifice and dedication that characterized the founders of the nation and added, "in the world struggle today, unless you have a belief in something greater than yourself as individuals and as a nation, we will back down."

"The only thing that will keep America great is if she lives out her true moral principles."

MRS. ROMNEY called "the new morality" nothing more than "old-fashioned morality." Every civilization, she said, has gone down "because they have practiced this sort of new morality."

Mrs. Romney was a guest at lunch with representatives from 30 nations attending the conference including Rajmohan Gandhi, grandson of the Mahatma, and the speaker of the morning, Col. Magnus L. Smith of the U.S. Army General Staff.

amounts of calcium chloride will be applied to further stabilize road base materials.

Bids will be solicited prior to the August council meeting.

The committee's letter did not stress the possibility of escalating costs for such services if used extensively. A request for a variance from lot size restrictions was considered and tabled until legal opinion could be rendered.


