



Scotland Rector Guest At 1st Baptist Church

The Aug. 9 guest preacher at Birmingham's First Baptist Church will be in America for the first time. He is the Rev. Canon A. E. Hodgkinson, rector of Holy Trinity Episcopal Church at Motherwell, Lanarkshire, Scotland. Canon Hodgkinson was educated at the high school of Glasgow and the theological college of the Episcopal Church in Scotland. He took the licentiate in theology at Durham University.

AFTER A curacy in Glasgow he was appointed preacher of St. Ninian's Cathedral, Perth, in the diocese of St. Andrew's.

Thereafter for six years he undertook to lead a group of three in home mission work in a development area in the Fife coalfield.

In 1954 he was appointed rector of Holy Trinity Church, Motherwell, in the diocese of Glasgow. He became secretary of the diocesan overseas board in 1958 and in 1959 toured mission stations in the diocese of St. Johns, South Africa, where the Scottish Episcopal Church has special commitments.

Canon Hodgkinson has taken particular interest in church unity. He has attended ecumenical conferences on a number of occasions in Sweden and Holland and was chairman of the Motherwell Council of Churches during 1958-61.

British Principal Is Guest Speaker

Principal H. Trevor Hughes, a member of the British Section of Methodist World Council of Churches, was guest speaker at Commerce Methodist Church Sunday evening.

An open house followed the services. Mr. Hughes is a graduate of Westminster College and Oxford University.

CANON HODGKINSON is also interested in church music, currently serving as secretary of the Scottish Episcopal Church music committee. Last year he was elected by the diocesan synod to be a canon of St. Mary's Cathedral, Glasgow.

Birmingham Family Attends Laboratory For Administrators

Centered on the church's ministry to youth, the 1964 Laboratory School for Administrators and Workers with Youth, July 25 to August 8, is being held at the American Baptist Assembly, Green Lake, Wis.

Mr. & Mrs. Robert L. Werner & family, members of First Baptist Church, Birmingham, are attending the school which will study the developmental task of the adolescent and discover how best to communicate the Gospel to him and how to help the adolescent respond to the Gospel in faith and love.

The school is also designed to help the participant discover the form his church's ministry with youth will take in light of who the young person is, the world in which we live and the Gospel.

College Dean To Speak at Kirk in Hills

The Rev. Dr. Ernest Gordon, Dean, Princeton University Chapel will be the guest preacher at the Kirk in The Hills, Bloomfield Hills, at the 9:30 a.m. and the 11:30 a.m. services Sunday.

A native of Scotland, Dr. Gordon completed his theological studies in Edinburgh and Glasgow, and also at the Hartford Seminary Foundation, Hartford, Conn. During World War II he served with the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders and for three and a half years was a prisoner of war of the Japanese.

DR. GORDON is the author of several books, the latest of which are: "Through the Valley of the Kwai" (1952), and "Miracle on the River Kwai" (1953). He has served churches in both Scotland and this country. In June, 1954, he was called to be the Presbyterian Chaplain at Princeton University, and was appointed Dean of the Chapel in 1955.

The Kirk in The Hills is presenting some of the leading preachers of the country this summer, with the Fall Chancel Choir singing at both services. Two sessions of the Kirk School are held concurrently with the worship services.

Reverend Fenner Attends Conference

The Rev. Raymond A. Fenner, 1200 Pierce, Birmingham, is attending the United Church of Christ's national conference in Deering, New Hampshire.

Christian educational directors and lay leaders of the denomination are present at the conference to discuss "Church Education in a Time of Revolution."
