OU Registrar Named Student Affairs Dean

Herbert N. Stoutenburg Jr., director of admissions and registrar at Oakland University since 1959, assumed new responsibilities this week, under an administrative change announced by D. B. Varner, chancellor.

In addition to continuing as registrar, Stoutenburg will serve as assistant to the chancellor and dean of student affairs. Brown, who has been associate director of admissions and director of scholarships for the past two years, will become director of admissions.

ACCORDING TO Stoutenburg, one of his primary assignments in the coming year will be the promotion of a more diversified student

life program on the Oakland campus, designed to provide students opportunity for participation in a complete program of extracurricular activities.

A former educational adviser in South Vietnam and Nigeria, he will also represent the University's interest in the Oakland County-Cauca Valley Project, an experimental program providing for the cooperation between the two communities on a local level.

In 1956-58 Stoutenburg was executive officer of the Michigan State University advisory group, working with the International Cooperation Administration and the government to establish an institute of civil administration, and in the summer of 1961 was adviser to the University of Nigeria for ad-

missions, scholarships, registration and general administration.

BROWN, WHO succeeds Stoutenburg as director of admissions, served as director of admissions at his alma mater, Kalamazoo College, before joining the Oakland staff in 1962. A native of Kalamazoo, the 35-year-old admissions officer has served as vice president of the Michigan Association of College Admissions Counselors, and is a member of the National Association of College Admissions Counselors.

Stoutenburg, a native of Detroit, received his bachelor's and master's degrees from MSU.

He is a member of American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers; Michigan

Council on Secondary School Curriculum; and Southeastern Michigan Association of College Agreement Schools, vice-president elect of Michigan Association of College Admissions and President of Rochester Kiwanis Club.

IN VIETNAM, he was president of the school board, American Community School, Saigon; and a member of the board of directors, American Community Church.

An Air Force navigator from 1941 to 1945, Stoutenburg is a major in the Air Force Reserve.
