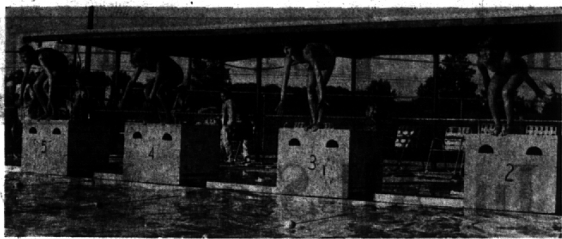
Each of these days the men are to congregate at the Birmingham Community House at 10 a.m. and proceed from this point by caravan at 10:30 a.m.

## Two Local Golfers In National Contest

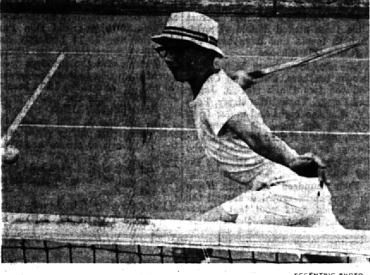
Holes-in-one scored by two Birmingham golfers may win one of them a trip to Scotland for two and \$1,000 in a national contest.
