Broomfield Says Viet Nam Still Campaign Issue

President Johnson's "fight-if-we-must" policy has dampened but not smothered the Vietnam crisis as a 1964 campaign issue, said Rep. William S. Broomfield (R-Mich) along with other key Republicans in Washington.

Broomfield said he backed the President's action, but "it does not mean the Viet Nam issue out of the presidential election campaign."

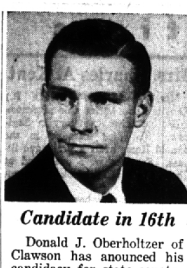
HE SAID that Viet Nam will definitely be discussed, for the administration has not been doing enough to win the war.

An amendment to the foreign aid bill which would allow more money for the defense of Viet Nam is backed by Rep. Broomfield.

Minority party members said they felt they had "no choice" but to unite behind the President in his reply to Communist aggression with retaliatory attacks on North Vietnamese coastal installations.

FORMER VICE President Richard M. Nixon, in Washington to meet with Barry Goldwater and other Republican leaders, told a reporter:

"It's too early to take Viet Nam out of the campaign. I hope the President's action presages more decisive moves, but what has happened is only part of the problem. The major problem is guerrilla war — that we need a plan."

Donald J. Oberholzer of Clawson has announced his candidacy for state senator for the 16th District. A design engineer and the father of five, his political background includes serving as precinct delegate and on the board of canvassers. Oberholzer, 33, said "Our democratic system of government includes men and women of different convictions, ideas and reasoning to have a voice in community affairs. Doctor Directs Medical Plan

Caldwell B. Esselstyn, M.D., has been appointed executive director of the Detroit area medical care plan for the Community Health Association.

Dr. Esselstyn is founder and medical director of the Rip Van Winkle Clinic, Hudson, N.Y., and is chairman of the Physicians Committee for Health Care for the Aged through Social Security.

C. Allen Harlan, 5535 N. Adams, Birmingham, is on the board of directors of the Community Health Association.

DR. ESSELSTYN is a diplomate of the American Board of Surgery, fellow of the American College of Surgeons, fellow of the American Public Health Association, member of the board of directors of the Health Insurance Plan of greater New York, member of the Albany Regional Hospital Planning Council and former president and chairman of the board of the Group Health Association of America.

The Community Health Association medical care plan, which began enrolling members Dec. 1, 1960, now serves approximately 55,000 people.

Credit Agency preparing credit reports.

During the next few years he holds similar positions with other financial institutions in the metropolitan area.

IN 1932 he joined forces with his brother and founded the R. B. Renfrew Co., a firm involved in economic research and investment counseling.

During World War II, Renfrew served on the War Production Board as finance director. The board was an agency designed to help small plants in obtaining financial help for their production.

"One year we set up \$117 million in loans for small producers in Michigan and part of Ohio," he recalled.

After the war, Renfrew joined Jan Handy where he presently holds the position of vice president of Detroit. He is responsible for the development of business in the nonautomotive area firm.

Renfrew; his wife, Louise; and their four children moved to Birmingham in 1958.

ALL OF the Renfrew children are married now and one daughter, Mrs. Fred (Robin) Bahr, lives in Birmingham. Charles and Robert B. reside in San Francisco and a third son, William F., is in Lansing.

The Renfrews have 10 grandchildren and the mayor's vacation time is spent in California.

Renfrew (6 foot, 5 inches), like most Kentuckians, played basketball in school.

He says he is a "mediocre" tennis player and a bridge ("I tend to overbid") buff.

Although he will not seek another term on the commission, Renfrew is not ruling out the possibility of running for a public office at a later date.

"I find that working in a public office such as the commission is very stimulating," Renfrew said and added that it would probably be even "more so" on a state level.
