Our three-scene preview illustrates what's in store for the fashion-conscious this season, as seen through eyes of Mr. Kidd.

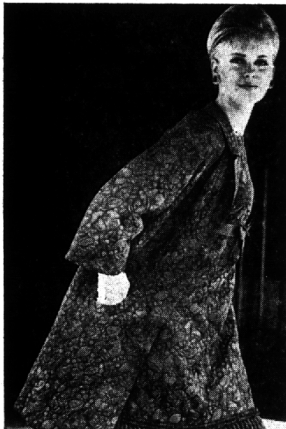

Sociable coat costume, (lower left) of imported pink and red brocade, features a tunic dress that's fringed at the hem line and banded high at the bosom with a bow.

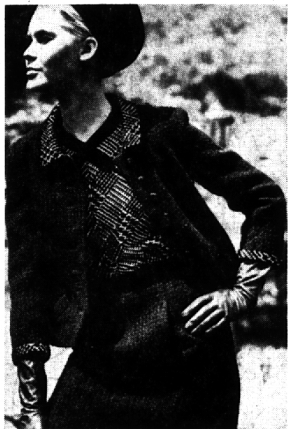

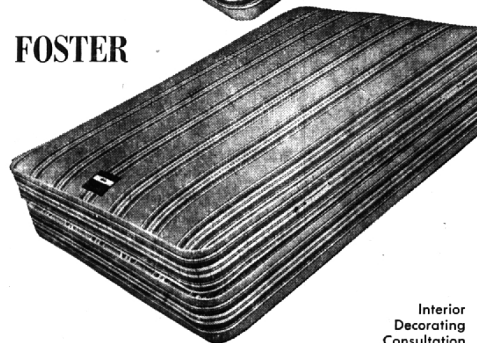
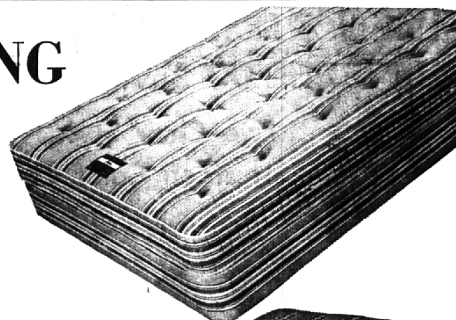
