LATHRUP - CRANBROOK VILLAGE

Hamiltons Spend 6 Weeks In Amazon Region, Peru

Dr. and Mrs. Quentin P. Hamilton and their children, Gwen, Bill and Greg, returned to their Lathrup Village home on Dolans recently following a six-week trip to the Amazon region and Peru. The family left June 24 and flew to Brazil where they spent one week first in Belem and then in Manaus studying the contrasts in the way of life.

Next they flew over the jungle to the inland capital of Brasilia. In their tour of the capital they marveled at the many new roads which seemed to be a series of cloverleafs with no cross sections whatsoever.

AFTER THEIR visit in Brasilia they went to visit friends in San Paulo. With their friends, the Robert Frisbies (who are former Detroiters located in San Paulo with Ford International), they went to see the Ignasus Falls. The falls are 2 1/2 to 3 miles in width, 1 1/2 times as tall as Niagara Falls and are situated in complete wilderness.

From the falls the Hamilton and Frisbie families (eleven in all) flew to Rio and toured Sugar Loaf, Serpentine Sidewalks and the statue of Christ among other points of interest.

In Lima, Peru, the Hamiltons explored the Inca and pre-Inca ruins and saw Cuzco, the capital of the Incas. Most interesting was seeing Macchu Picchu, a mountain side Inca town that is more preserved than any other today.

In Bolivia they went just outside of La Paz to see Lake Titicaca which is the highest navigable water in the world.

After returning once again to Lima the Hamiltons returned to their home probably to begin planning their next trip.

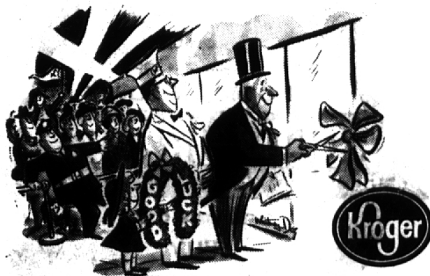


Will Marry
