were no weavers and few sculptors. An atmosphere of gritty and simple human contact prevailed. This was a rare opportunity to meet some of the artists whose works I've admired in the past, like the Stephensons who are superb potters.

ONE ENCOURAGING result of the fair was the fact that the really poor, garish paintings did not sell well. They were painful to see, those works painted for the tourist trade, and I was pleased to discover that the tourists are developing taste.

Among the offbeat booths was one featuring bejeweled eggs. "Everyone asked, 'Are they real?'" They were. A glass blower lured a fascinated crowd around him. A wood carver whittled out eagles in the Early American style, and a potter demonstrated forming ceramics on a wheel.

Most of the works would have looked better in a gallery but it tests your discrimination to pick out the gems among the multitude of choices. The fair was fun and brought the artists into the open (?)

And more to the point, Dorothy sold most of her ceramics.

State Tourist Council Reports on Campsites

Increasing interest in camping in recent years has kept the demand ahead of the supply although Michigan has more than 10,000 campsites in state parks for 1964 visitors.

The Michigan Tourist Council advises campers that they should consider the more than 4,000 campsites in state and federal forests and in county and township parks if they find their favorite state park full.

In addition, camping is permitted on most of the more than seven million acres of public forest

land in the northern two-thirds of the state, even though there are no designated campsites. State parks offer the most complete facilities, in most cases, with bathhouses, flush toilets, electricity and concession stores. For use of these facilities a \$2 annual or 50-cent daily park permit is required in addition to a \$1 daily camping fee and a 25-cent daily use charge for electricity if desired.

THROUGH Labor Day campers are limited to 15 days in any one

state park with an additional 30 days during other months of the year. No reservations are accepted for state park campsites. Some of the county and township parks also charge a fee to cover maintenance, and campers should inquire about these charges locally.

There are no fees for camping in state and national forest campgrounds, most of which have pit toilets, picnic tables, fireplaces and a water supply. There are no attendants at these camp grounds, but camping is limited to 20 days at one site in state forests and 21 days in federal forests.

designated camp grounds, no permits or fees are required, and there is no restriction on camping except during the November deer season when a registration card, available at license dealers, is required.

A directory of Michigan camping facilities is available without charge from the Michigan Tourist Council, Lansing 48926.
