

Robbers Escape With \$460 Cash

The night manager and a porter at the new Holiday Inn in Bloomfield Township were held up early Monday morning by two armed bandits wearing stocking masks. They escaped with about \$460 cash. Donald Lucich of Plymouth, the night manager, said two men walked into the motel through the back door at 1801 S. Telegraph about 4 a.m., waving a shotgun and a revolver.

THE PORTER, Ray Burton of

Pontiac, was told to lie on the floor and was hit in the back with the shotgun, police said.

Lucich told police the robbers took \$400 from the cash register and safe, and Burton's wallet containing about \$60 and identification was reported stolen.

Burton and Lucich were forced into a closet while the robbers made their getaway. Apparently the two escaped on foot to an automobile near the motel, police said.

State Board Okays School Bond Issue

The \$5.3 million bond issue passed by Birmingham School District voters in June has been approved for sale by the Michigan Municipal Finance Commission.

Bids for the bonds will be let on Sept. 22. Revenues from the bonds will be used to construct new schools and make major improvements to existing buildings in the school district.

Political Sign Squabble Moves To Court Arena

Latest developments in the squabble over destroyed political signs: The examination of Berkeley constable Roy M. West moved into its second day Wednesday in Bloomfield Township justice court. He is charged with destroying the signs of William E. Lang, a senior assistant prosecutor, who is running for the Republican nomination as prosecutor.

Lang is scheduled to appear in Berkeley Municipal Court today to face charges of being a disorderly person. West claims Lang used "insulting and annoying language" to him on Aug. 10.

THE DISPUTE started like this: On Aug. 10 two large billboards promoting Lang for prosecutor were defaced, or destroyed, at Big Beaver and Woodward in Bloomfield Township.

Lang issued a warrant against West and Joe Rayman, Jr., 4060 W. Maple, Bloomfield Township, a deputy sheriff, accusing them of the destruction.

West retorted with a warrant for Lang, claiming he (Lang) used insulting language when he confronted West at his home with the accusation that he destroyed the billboards.

RAYMAN CHARGED that Lang "molested" him by pushing him during the argument in front of West's home.

Both West and Rayman are working for Robert Templin, also an assistant prosecutor vying for the prosecutor nomination.

Templin said Lang's charges were "part of a smear campaign" against him. He said he had no knowledge of any of his workers damaging political signs.

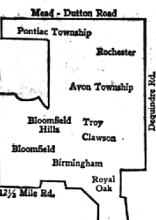
