**GM Sponsors  
Convention  
For Teachers**

The ninth annual General Motors Conference for high school science and mathematics teachers begins in Warren Aug. 23 with 54 teachers from nine states planning to attend.

Forty-six of them will be winding up summer employment in 23 GM divisions and four central staff organizations. At the opening session of the one-week conference they will be joined by six science and mathematics teachers from Detroit Archdiocese high schools and two from the Rochester, N.Y., Diocese.

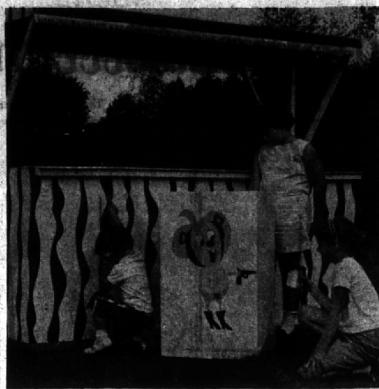
Much of the program will involve central staff groups at GM Technical Center, including research laboratories, engineering staff, styling staff and manufacturing development. Visits also are scheduled for the proving ground at Milford, GM Institute at Flint and Pontiac Motor Division at Pontiac.

ALSO, THE TEACHERS will meet with various GM executives to discuss personnel, educational, training, public relations, scholarship and other programs GM sponsors to supplement both teacher and student education. Special presentations will also be made.

Representing schools in Michigan, New York, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Missouri, New Jersey, Ohio and Texas the teachers were selected by GM divisions and staffs in consultation with local school administrators.

Teachers, their schools and sponsoring GM divisions and staffs include Ray E. Aley, Jr., Troy High School (GM Research Laboratories); Beermann C. Brewbaker, Southfield Senior High School (Detroit Diesel Engine Division); Floyd W. Bunt, Cranbrook School (Cadillac Motor Car Division); and William T. Hyry, Bloomfield Hills High School (GM Engineering Staff).

Three Birmingham teen-agers, who are members of the Michigan Youth Chorus, visited the statue of independence hero Jose Artigas in Montevideo's Plaza Independencia. It was shown to them by an old friend.

The Birmingham youths are Charles Lettler, 6745 Colby Lane; John McKenzie, 5855 Wingeroff Court; and Rachel Weaver, 440 S. Cranbrook.

Their host was Eduardo Alvarez who just returned to his home in Uruguay after living in Birmingham six months with Dr. and Mrs. John Sison, 120 Overhill Road.

EDUARDO WAS in Michigan through the Youth For Understanding Teen-age Exchange Program, of which the youth Chorus—Michigan's 66 singing teen-age ambassadors to South America—is a part.

Lettler lived with the Alvarez family during the Youth Chorus's 17-day stay in Uruguay.

The Youth Chorus has presented a series of programs ranging from appearances in schools and community centers to formal concerts in major music houses and on television in the capital city of Montevideo and also in smaller interior cities.

THE GROUP flew July 28 to Buenos Aires, Argentina for a five-day visit, and then to Santiago, Chile, for the final 10 days of the seven-week concert program. Before arriving in Uruguay the Youth Chorus had two weeks of concert programs in Brazil—one week in Rio de Janeiro and the second in Campinas near the industrial center of Sao Paulo.

The nationally recognized St. Andrew's Bagpipe Band and the Highland Dancers, sponsored by the St. Andrew's Society of Detroit, will perform for senior citizens on Old Timers Day, Sept. 2, at the Michigan State Fair, which runs from Aug. 23, through Labor Day, Sept. 7.

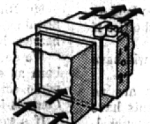

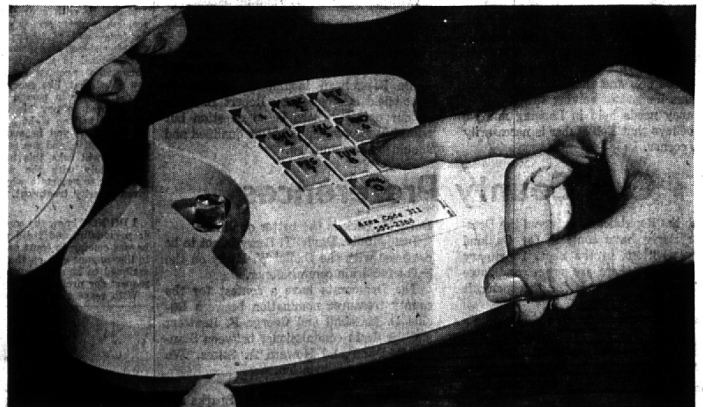
