Rehabilitation Clinic Treats Body, Spirit

Torch Drive dollars, positive thinking and the fine equipment make the Rehabilitation Institute one of the nation's most modern and effective facilities for repairing damage to body or spirit caused by disease or accident.

Dr. Joseph N. Schaeffer, director of the Institute at 261 Brady, first unit in Detroit's Medical Center, expressed the thinking behind the wealth of equipment and highly-trained specialists when he said:

"We never say: 'This man has a bad leg.'"

"Instead, we say: 'This man has a good leg.'"

MEDICATION AND retraining completes the job. During the past year, 537 men and women occupied beds in the Institute. Another 2,014 came to the Institute for outpatient services. Of the bed patients, two were from Birmingham as were 27 who went there for outpatient services.

The Institute was built in 1956 adjoining Harper Hospital, from funds provided by the Metropolitan Detroit Building Fund and the Federal Government.

The Metropolitan Detroit Polio Foundation was created as Torch Drive agency after the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis refused to accept Torch Drive dollars. It sought to provide rehabilitation treatment for polio patients. Space was obtained in Herman Kiefer Hospital.

The United Foundation realized, however, that there were many other than polio sufferers who needed rehabilitation. The new building was completed, and patients from the rehabilitation section in Herman Kiefer and from the Curative Workshop, a Torch Drive agency, were transferred there. Help was provided for every type of disability.

Walter C. Laidlaw, executive vice president of the United Foundation, earlier this year was helped to recover from the effects of a slight stroke by therapy at the Institute.

Mario Wallenda of the "Flying Wallendas" critically injured in the collapse of a human pyramid atop a high wire in which Dieter

Scheppe and Richard Faughnan were killed at the Shrine Circus at the Michigan State Fairgrounds in January, 1963, fought his way back to partial recovery through use of Institute facilities.

CURRENTLY, Johnny White of Warren, "Rookie of the Year" at the 1964 Indianapolis 500-mile auto race, and whose spine was crushed in a track accident at Terre Haute, Ind., was removed to the Institute for help on the road to recovery.

When a patient is brought to the Institute, a physician first determines the nature of his disability and determines upon a program for restoration, working in close cooperation with the patient's physician.

Occupational therapy assists the patient to develop skill and power despite his disability. Physical therapy, including the use of specially-designed apparatus, is used to strengthen muscles.

Emphasis is placed on teaching patients to perform tasks which able-bodied persons consider routine, but which would be impossible for the disabled without long and specialized training.

Speech and hearing help is given when needed. Recreational activities are an important aid to recovery as well as contributing toward the mental well-being of the patient.

INSTITUTE TREATMENT often is eliminated by providing the patient with preliminary training toward the development of vocational skills.

The Rehabilitation Institute is an integral part of the overall

program of the United Foundation to provide needed medical services to the community. It coordinates its program with those of other Torch Drive agencies.

Patients who have recovered to a point where they can receive further occupational training are sent to the Detroit League for the Handicapped. League clients, in turn, are sent to the Institute for therapy.

The treatment of the Sister Elizabeth Kenney Foundation for polio patients is given at the Institute. The Multiple Sclerosis Society, another Torch Drive agency, holds its meetings there.

Twelve blind teen-agers took part in a training program which was developed by the Institute in cooperation with the Society for the Blind, still another Torch Drive

agency, during the summer months.

PATIENTS ARE referred to the Institute by many Torch Drive and tax-supported agencies working in the health field. Institute staff doctors are called upon to advise other agencies in rehabilitation problems.

Doctors on the staff of the Institute teach in the Wayne University Medical School, and medical students from Wayne receive training at the Institute. Four-week seminars in rehabilitation nursing are conducted for the benefit of graduate nurses.

In addition to the linotype and intertype, several other line casting machines have been developed for use in the composing room.
