Glass Lends Drama to New S'field Bldg.

An indoor environment incorporating the feeling of freedom and roominess of all outdoors is enjoyed by workers in the new Detroit Federal Employees Credit Union building in Southfield because large glass areas admit natural light and scenic beauty. Window walls of polished plate glass are tinted neutral grey to create an expensive visual link to

The soft grey tint of plate glass absorbs a portion of the sun's heat and reduces solar glare and sky brightness without changing colors viewed through it. THE NEW building also has clerestory windows of clear rough plate glass to let in additional daylight, further brightening the interior. The glass has configura-

with relatively high light transmission. It was used for a "courtyard" effect, giving the interior diffused natural light and an "airy" feeling. Designed by the Detroit architectural firm of Lorenz, Paski, Begrow, and Brown Associates, the new building is described as a dig-

The openness of the glass walls draws members and potential members into the interior, featuring a hanging two-story garden in the main lobby. The credit union's move to its new building marked the beginning of an era of expansion in facilities and personnel. The Detroit office has increased membership steadily since it began business in 1929 with 24 members and \$1,000 subscribed to shares.
