About 20,000 Michigan residents beat the Aug. 10 deadline in applying for licenses to hunt in the state's first elk season, Dec. 5-13.

All with applicants having an antlerless deer license are eligible for licenses by machine at a drawing to be held Aug. 26 in Lansing. Odds of getting a license are about 65 to 1 against each applicant.

Department workers are busy preparing applications for data-processing machines. As soon as the drawing is completed, checks and money orders will be returned to unsuccessful applicants.

Liberal Deer Hunting Regulations for 1964

With Michigan's deer herd heading into the fall in near-record numbers, the Conservation Commission set 1964 firearm regulations designed for taking most of this year's huntable whitetail antlers.

If combined with good hunting conditions during the November season, these liberal regulations should yield over 125,000 antlers in the legal kill column from a herd expected to total 800,000 when sportsmen take to the woods.

The projected kill figure is above last season's firearm harvest of 124,000 and includes about 65,000 antlers.

Youth Hostels Offer Basic Sailing Class

The American Youth Hostels will offer basic sailing instruction beginning Sunday, Sept. 13. The 18-hour course includes a dockside lecture in sailing theory and boat handling instruction aboard the AYH Fleet of seven Intrepid Sloops.
