

B'ham Schools' Special Classes Adds to Staff

New staff members have joined the Special Education Program this year, according to Bernard Maslanik, coordinator of Special Services for the Birmingham Public Schools.

The new staff members are Jack Molloy, diagnostician; Mrs. Florence Warnock, school nurse; Lawrence Savage, teacher-consultant, emotionally disturbed; and Marilyn Lake, special education, (mentally handicapped).

THE DEPARTMENT now has six school nurses, two diagnosticians, seven speech therapists, one teacher-counselor for the physically handicapped, one teacher-consultant, and four teachers for the mentally handicapped. Current vacancies include a visiting teacher and a special education (mentally handicapped) teacher.

This year the program will continue to provide three half-days per month for the adjusted study program and the visiting teacher program. Dr. Warren S. Kennison is the psychiatric consultant.

Facilities provided for the Special Education program include five mentally handicapped classrooms and two adjusted study rooms.

School Grounds Ready for Fall

Assistant Superintendent Norman Wolfe and Supervisor of Building and Grounds James V. O'Neil have reported that the Building and Grounds Department of the Birmingham Public Schools has been busy getting the schools ready for the opening of school, Sept. 10.

During the summer months classrooms have been cleaned, floors waxed, and furniture refinished. In addition, gym floors have been cleaned and resurfaced and thousands of windows have been washed.

TWO HUNDRED twenty-five acres of land has been maintained, roofs on all schools have been repaired, sidewalks at many schools, and blacktop repairs have been made at Groves and Seaholm High Schools. A new filter has been installed in the Barnum swimming pool.

Among the many other jobs, the maintenance department has made temporary classrooms at Seaholm, Quarton, Berkshire and Harlan Schools to take care of increased enrollment until the new schools and additions are completed.

The exteriors of Pembroke and Pierce Elementary Schools and Barnum Junior High School, have been painted and the boilers have been repaired and cleaned, ready for use this winter.

Home Arts exhibits will have a new home at the Michigan State Fair, Aug. 28 through Sept. 7. The new \$600,000 Home Arts Building is completed, except for the auditorium. The building will be available for year-around use by community groups.

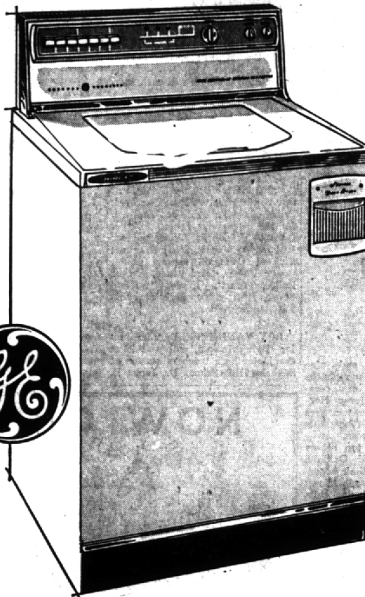

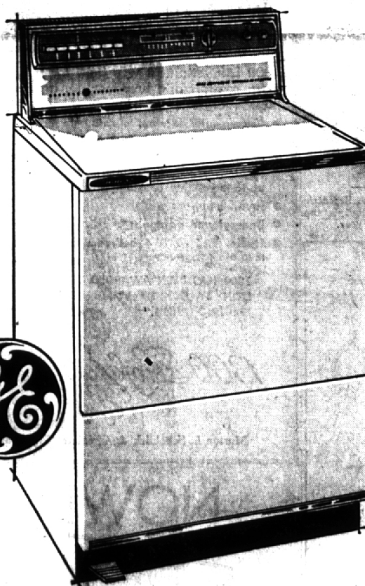
