Clawson Lawyer Seeks Seat in 66th District

William A. O'Brien, Clawson attorney and former councilman, was filed for the Democratic nomination for the state legislature from the 66th House district.

The 66th House district includes the cities of Madison Heights, Clawson, Hazel Park, north of 8 Mile and Troy to 16 Mile west of Livernois, and 18 Mile east of Livernois.

"Pressing issues face the State and Nation," said O'Brien. "The population explosion yearly demands more elementary and secondary classrooms and teachers. What future faces our children, unless we plan for future needs today."

"College classrooms and teachers will not exist for these children, unless the community and the State act now. The Oakland County Community College is a first step towards two-year colleges. What about the four-year colleges? What about Oakland University? Why hasn't the legislature acted?"

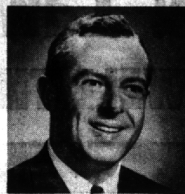

O'BRIEN, 34, lives at 1361 North Selfridge, Clawson, with his wife, Stuart, and their five children. A graduate of Holy Cross College, with law degree from Yale Law School, O'Brien served in the Navy during the Korean War.

A lecturer at University of Detroit Law School, in 1959-60, he currently maintains law offices in Warren and in Mt. Clemens.

He is currently a member of the Democratic State Central Committee from South Oakland County, vice-chairman of the State Platform and Resolutions Committee, and an alternate delegate to the 1964 Democratic National Convention.

Howard Allen Stites of Pontiac is seeking the Democratic nomination for Oakland County Drain Commissioner. The 41-year-old man has previously been precinct delegate, Pontiac.
