Lutherans To Construct CMU Chapel

Delegates at the 71st Convention of the Michigan District of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, meeting at Concordia College in Ann Arbor, approved two far-reaching items of business. The first calls for the erection of a student center and chapel at Central Michigan University at Mt. Pleasant. Construction is slated to begin not later than the fall of 1965 and is expected to cost in the neighborhood of \$170,000.
