The outside is patterned after shops along Fleet Street in London. An avenue known for its haberdashery shops.

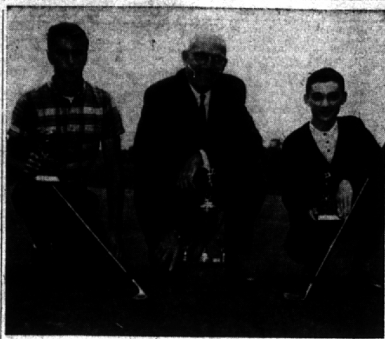
THE INTERIOR will feature three chandeliers and one entire wall will be covered by a 44 foot by 8 foot piece of red felt.

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 113

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 67 KNOWN AS THE ZONING ORDINANCE.

The Township of Bloomfield Ordains: Section 1.01. That Ordinance No. 67 known as the Zoning Ordinance be amended to provide a new sub-section to Section 1601, said amendment reading as follows:

Section 1601—Sub-Section 6. Whenever the buildings, land and uses thereof as set forth on the application are in conformity with the provisions of this Ordinance, it shall be the duty of the Building Inspector to issue within 5 days after the receipt of said application a building permit, and when such permit is refused, to state such refusal in writing with the reasons therefor.

Section 2.01. The provisions of this ordinance are hereby given immediate effect pursuant to the provisions of Section 11 and Section 14 of Act 184 of the Public Acts of 1943 as amended. Made and passed by the Township Board of Bloomfield Township, Oakland County, Michigan, this 24th day of August, A. D. 1964.

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 112

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 67 KNOWN AS THE ZONING ORDINANCE.

The Township of Bloomfield Ordains: Section 1.01. That Ordinance No. 67 known as the Zoning Ordinance be amended to provide new sub-sections, reading as follows, to-wit:

ARTICLE II—DEFINITION Section 200.9 i. Stable, private: Private stable is a stable or building for the keeping of horses for the non-commercial use of the residents of the principal use and shall not include the keeping of horses for other or for commercial housing of horses.

ARTICLE IV Section 401. (9) Private Stable, when permitted by the Board of Appeals, for not more than 1 horse on a lot where said lot or parcel is not less than 2 acres in area; and provided further; that for each additional horse stabled thereon, one additional contiguous acre of land shall be located in the rear yard. In no instance shall a horse be contained nearer than 75 feet to any property line. No horse shall be allowed to run at large.

Section 2.01. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby given immediate effect pursuant to the provisions of Section 11 and Section 14 of Act 184 of the Public Acts of 1943 as amended. Made and passed by the Township Board of Bloomfield Township, Oakland County, Michigan, this 24th day of August, A. D. 1964.
