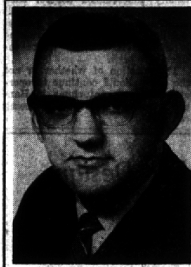


Riding the Rails At World's Fair

Their Voices Open World of Learning To Blind Students

There's a very select group of volunteers hoping—literally—to be hearing from you during Health-O-Rama week at Northland, Aug. 31 through Sept. 6.

They invite you to listen to the sound of your own voice at their booth under the giant tent. Recording for the blind is their organization, and their hope is that you'll be intrigued into auditioning formally at Detroit unit headquarters in Kresge Library, Wayne State University.

BE WARNED: only about half of the formal auditions pass the approval of the panel of judges, some sighted and some blind. But

there's still a need for you, according to two Birmingham residents who have not only made the grade but who count every hour of service as a privilege.

Godfrey Strelinger, 294 Linden, is "Mr. RFB" in Detroit. When he retired in 1957 as vice president of American Motors, he was asked to establish the volunteer unit by Walter Laidlaw, executive secretary of the United Foundation. Strelinger was chairman for four years and is now not only treasurer but one of the unit's top readers.

This is the verdict of Mrs. Lewis Fantle, 1729 Hammond Court, Bloomfield Hills, who is current chairman.

What do they do? They make talking textbooks for blind collegians, and adults seeking vocational or professional training. What is the reward? The knowledge that these handicapped students can attend classes on an equal footing with the sighted.

YOU WOULDN'T be likely to relax, Mrs. Fantle points out, reading a text on fluid mechanics,

woodworking, history or math. Your hours would be long.

But there's a thrill to lending your eyes, Mr. Strelinger says. And if you don't pass the audition, you are still needed as monitor, machine operator and audio-proof-reader. There's always a backlog of requests from blind students, whose current needs run to more than 1600 titles a year, or about 10 thousand copies.

Tapes are edited by the 15 RFB units throughout the country and sent to New York.

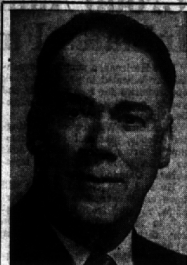
There, they are recorded on 7-inch vinyl discs, about an hour's reading to a disc and about 25 of them for the average 500-page text.

WHAT NEXT? Illustrations no less, to be "seen" by the sensitive fingers of the blind. This is the pet project of still another local resident, John F. Agar, 4245 Cranbrook Cross Road.

He is incoming president of the Telephone Pioneers, longtime Michigan Bell employees who started with RFB by maintaining the recording equipment. Now, aided by a group of Bell secretaries, they are tracing all kinds of technical diagrams and illustrations to be processed into raised-line drawings.

You'll see them, along with the tape recorders, at the Health-O-Rama. And all the volunteers second Mrs. Fantle's invitation: "Let us hear from you."

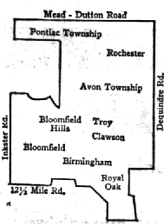
