# Peace Corps Sends Man To Iran

Stephen Fairbanks will embark on Sept. 9 for Iran to work as a Peace Corps volunteer. Now on home leave, he will be in Iran for 21 months teaching English as a second language in a high school or college.

Son of Mrs. Gerald G. Fairbanks, of 309 N. Eton in Birmingham, he was graduated in 1960 from Cranbrook School where he worked as editor of the school newspaper. He graduated in May of this year with a B.A. in anthropology from the University of Michigan, where he also studied zoology and Near Eastern studies. While at the university he was a lecturer and guide at the University Exhibit Museum.

FAIRBANKS WILL be leaving with 75 other volunteers for the same project. The group trained for the past 11 weeks at the University of Michigan, where they received intensive instruction in Farsi, the language of Iran, and learned modern methods of teaching English as a foreign language. The trainees attended lectures on the history, culture and traditions of Iran as well as courses in American and international politics and economics. The volunteers will be scattered over the entire country of Iran for their 21 months of service.

# Unique Navy Tank Ship Visits Inland Waterways

The USS DeSoto County, a Navy tank landing ship (LST), has been host to over 250,000 visitors in the first two months of her three-month Great Lakes cruise. To date, the ship has visited 10 cities in Michigan, New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Minnesota and Wisconsin.

A unit of the Amphibious Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet, the DeSoto County was ordered on the cruise by the Commander in Chief of the Atlantic Fleet, Admiral H.P. Smith, USN. The LST is the first amphibious ship to visit the inland waterways in recent years.

Visits by the ship to inland ports include demonstrations, exhibits and tours through the vessel. Underwater Demolition Team 22 has shown the visitors the techniques and equipment that have made the Frogmen famous.

INCLUDED IN the equipment are a 166 millimeter recoilless rifle with a range of four to five miles, a tank killer mounting five 106mm rifles, a modern tracked amphibious landing vehicle, a 52-ton tank. The film is shown on a panoramic screen aboard the ship, over ten miles and a giant eight-inch self-propelled howitzer.

Marine forces aboard the ship, under the command of Maj. John A. O'Brien of New York City, also have a karate team and a 25-voice chorus from the Second Marine Division. Concerts by the choral group and demonstrations in self-defense by the karate team have been favorites with the visitors and have made numerous television appearances.

DeSoto County is one of the newest ships of her type. The tank landing ship is designed to carry tanks and other heavy equipment and land them on beaches and causeways, thus bridging the gap from ship to shore.

With her shallow draft, the ship can actually move into an enemy beach, run herself aground and discharge her cargo directly onto the beach with her bow ramp.

COMMANDERED by Lt. Com. Horace D. Mann, Jr., of Portsmouth, Va., the LST was commissioned June 10, 1958, at New Orleans. La. She is 442 feet long and 62 feet wide. When fully loaded she displaces 7,804 tons, more than five times that of her World War II counterpart.

She can steam 20,000 miles without refueling, has a top speed of better than 15 knots and carries 30 officers and 604 enlisted men when fully loaded with troops. The ship's company consists of 10 officers and 174 men.

The August month of the cruise

by the DeSoto County included visits to Chicago, Great Lakes, Ill.; Muskegon, Mich.; Manitowish, Wis.; Cleveland, Ohio; Oswego, N.Y.; and Clayton, N.Y.

DeSoto County previously visited Detroit, Bay City, Sault Ste. Marie and Marquette in Michigan.
