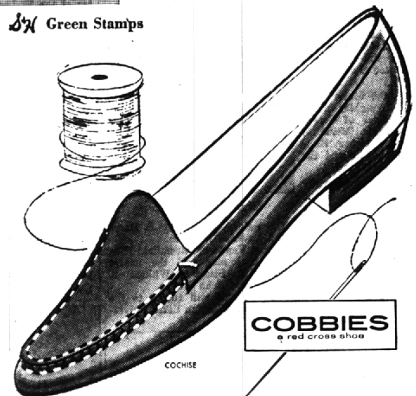
This time the clothes are for Taylor's new comedy called "Bookman Place" and will co-star Arlene Francis, Madeleine Carroll with Fernand Gravet.

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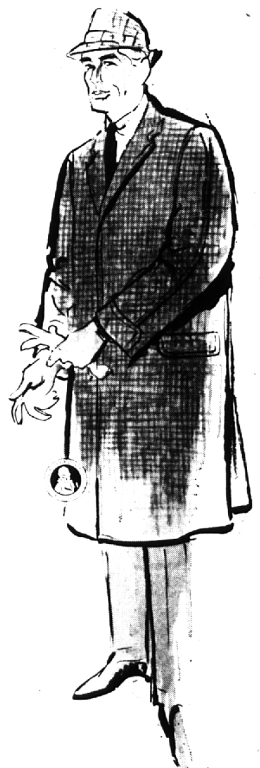
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
